Unpaid Work *In Sheffield*



Greenhill School



Before

Lyn Burton the Bursar at Greenhill Primary School rang in May 2006 to inquire if it was possible for us to paint the inside of the School. A visit was arranged for later the same month with Lyn to evaluate the job.

The School required the main dining room and six classrooms re-decorating following other trades who would be fitting new PVA windows and new inter-active white boards, during the schools summer holidays.

During

The work was carried out through the schools six week summer holiday period by groups of up to six offenders with one supervisor.



The main dining room had to have all the murals sanded back so that they did not show through the new paint work. The walls were then given three coats of primer and two coats of emulsion.

Facts & Figures

The school required the job to be completed in the six week summer holidays, the work was started on the Saturday after the school was closed and completed in five weeks.

After

The work commenced on the first weekend of the schools summer holiday. The entire job, dining hall and all the designated classrooms were completed within a five week period. The five weeks breaks down into 25 work days. Each day one supervisor was in attendance with 5-6 offenders each day, this equates to approx 775 offender hours.
